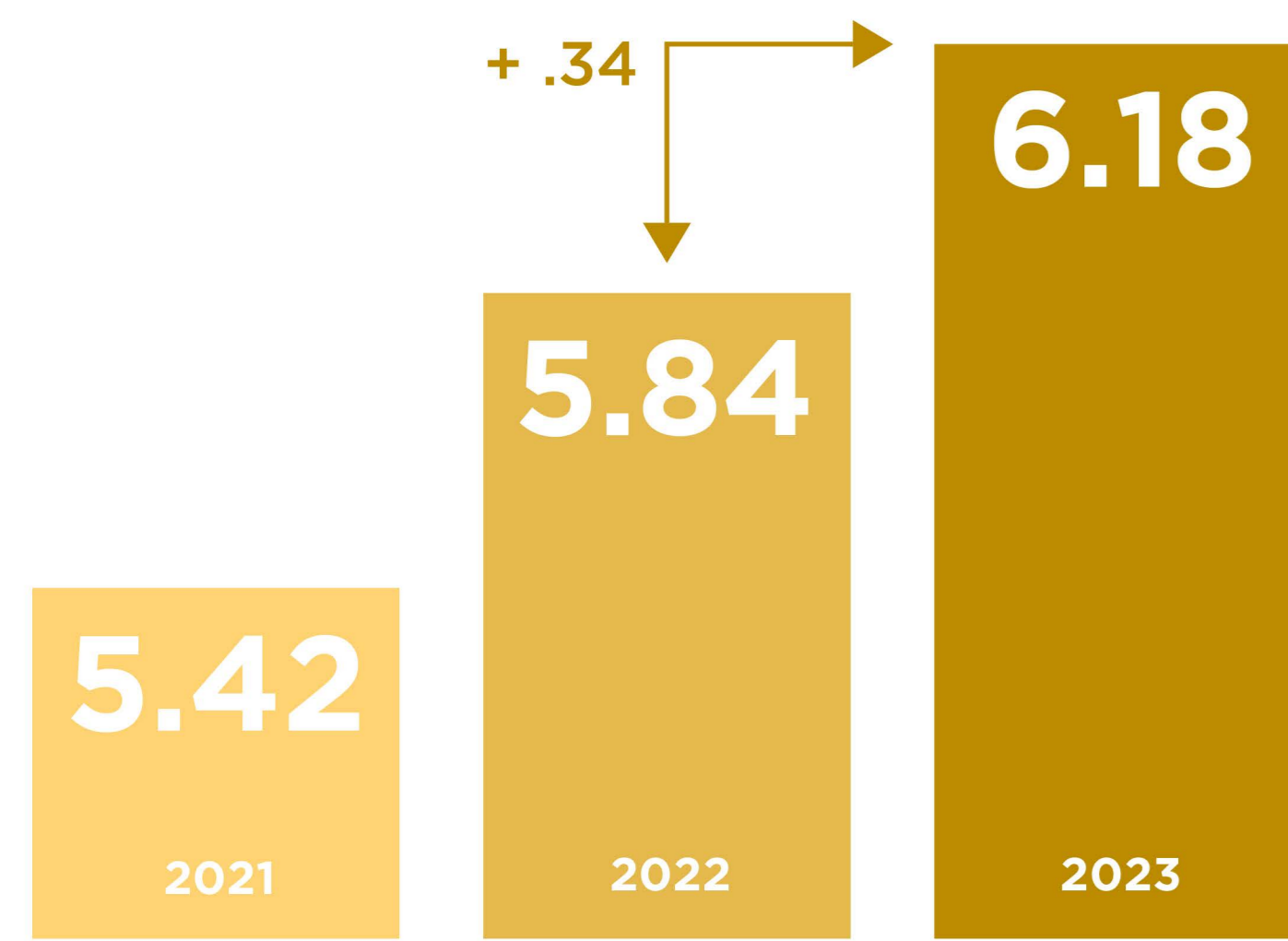


#1 2023's Return to School...



Mean Rating of Learning Experience, 2021-2023

When asked about their biggest challenges in going #BacktoSchool

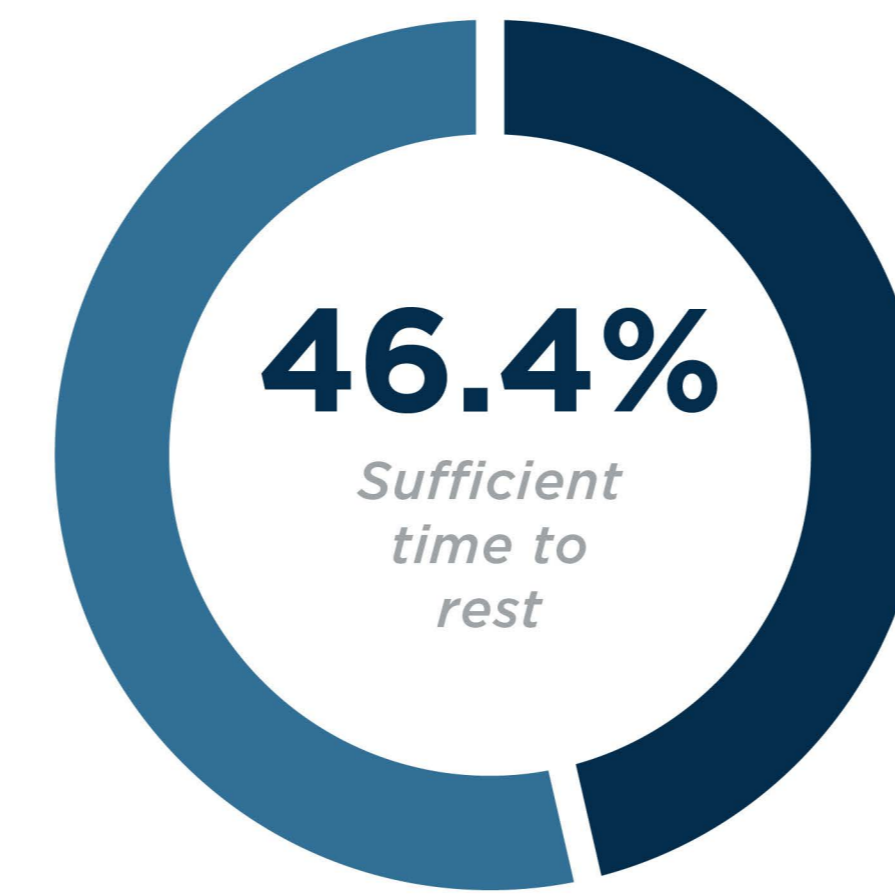

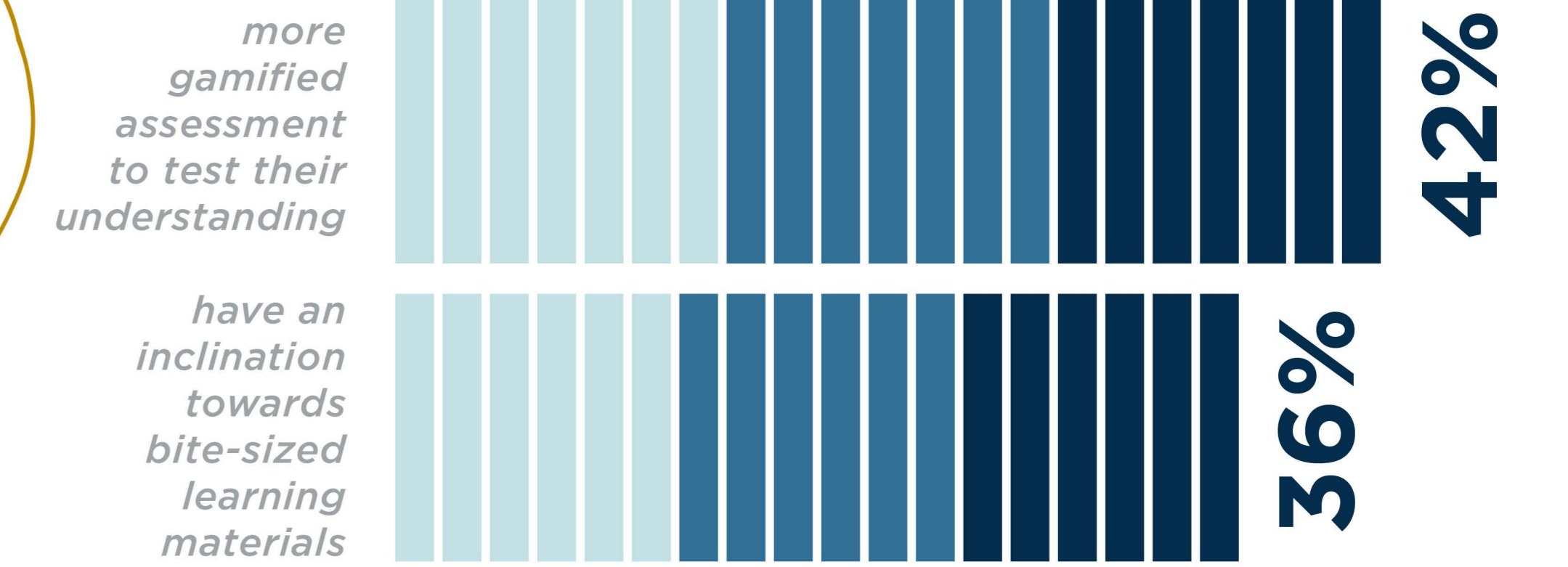

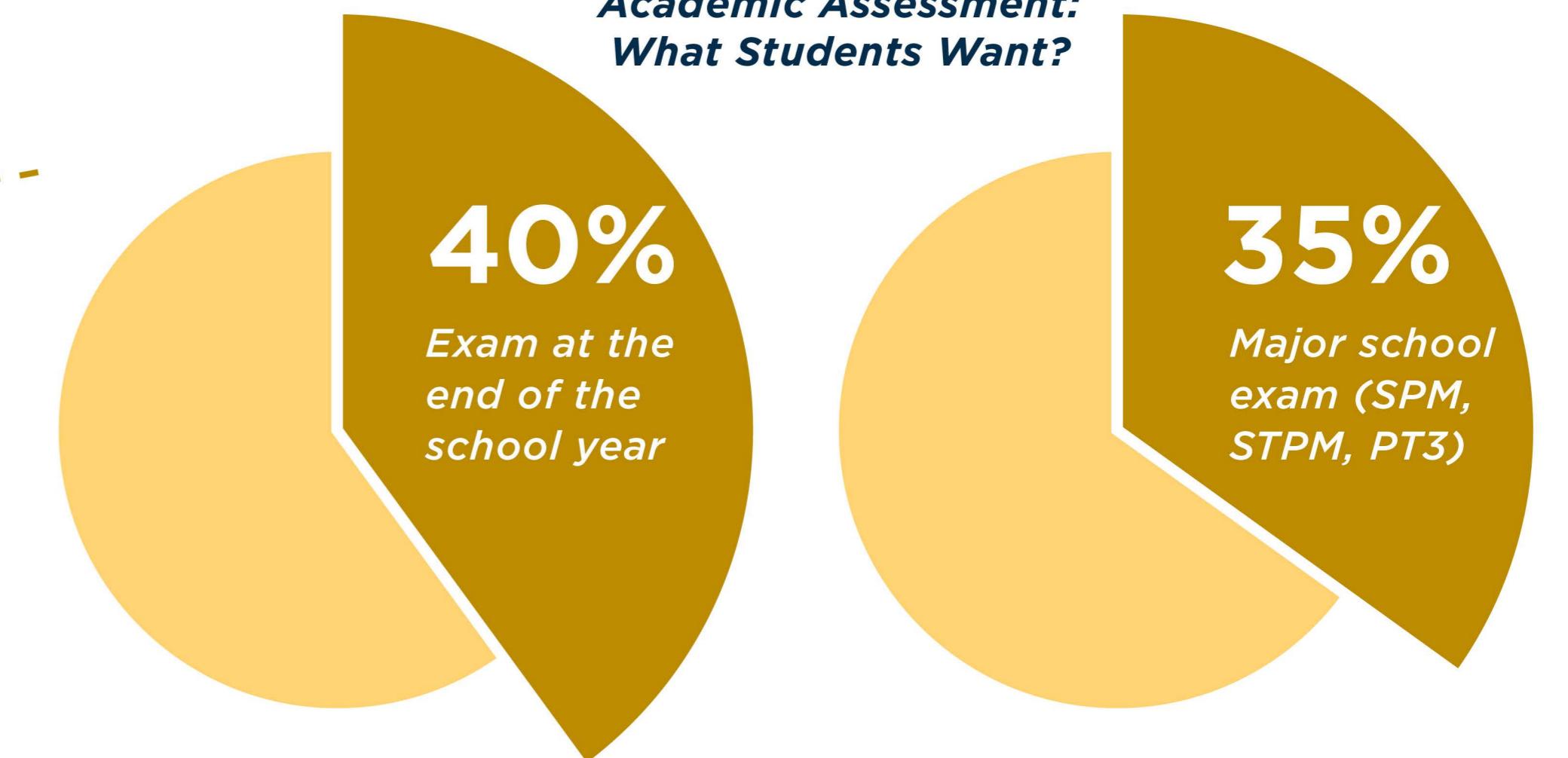
What support do you need to improve your learning experience?



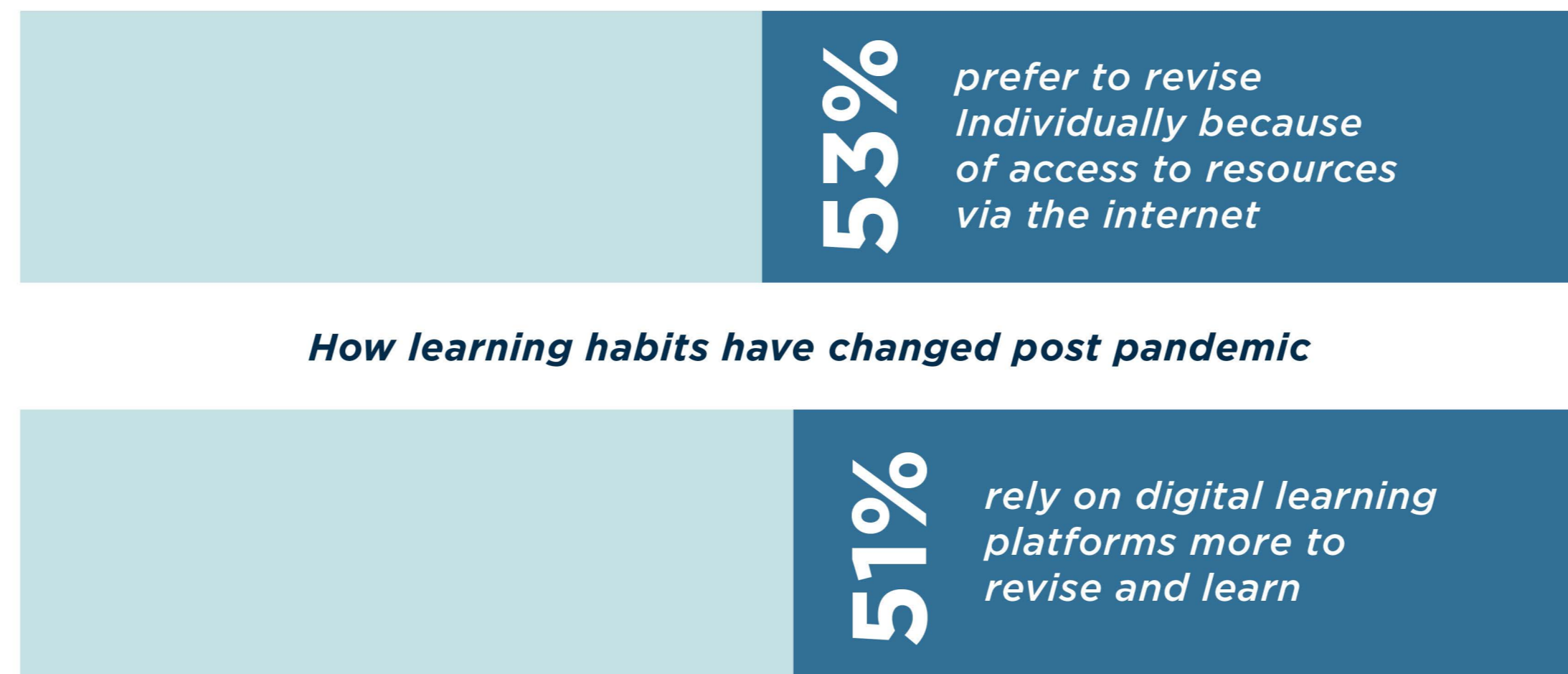
Students' Perspective :

35% of students rate their well-being* more positively than last year

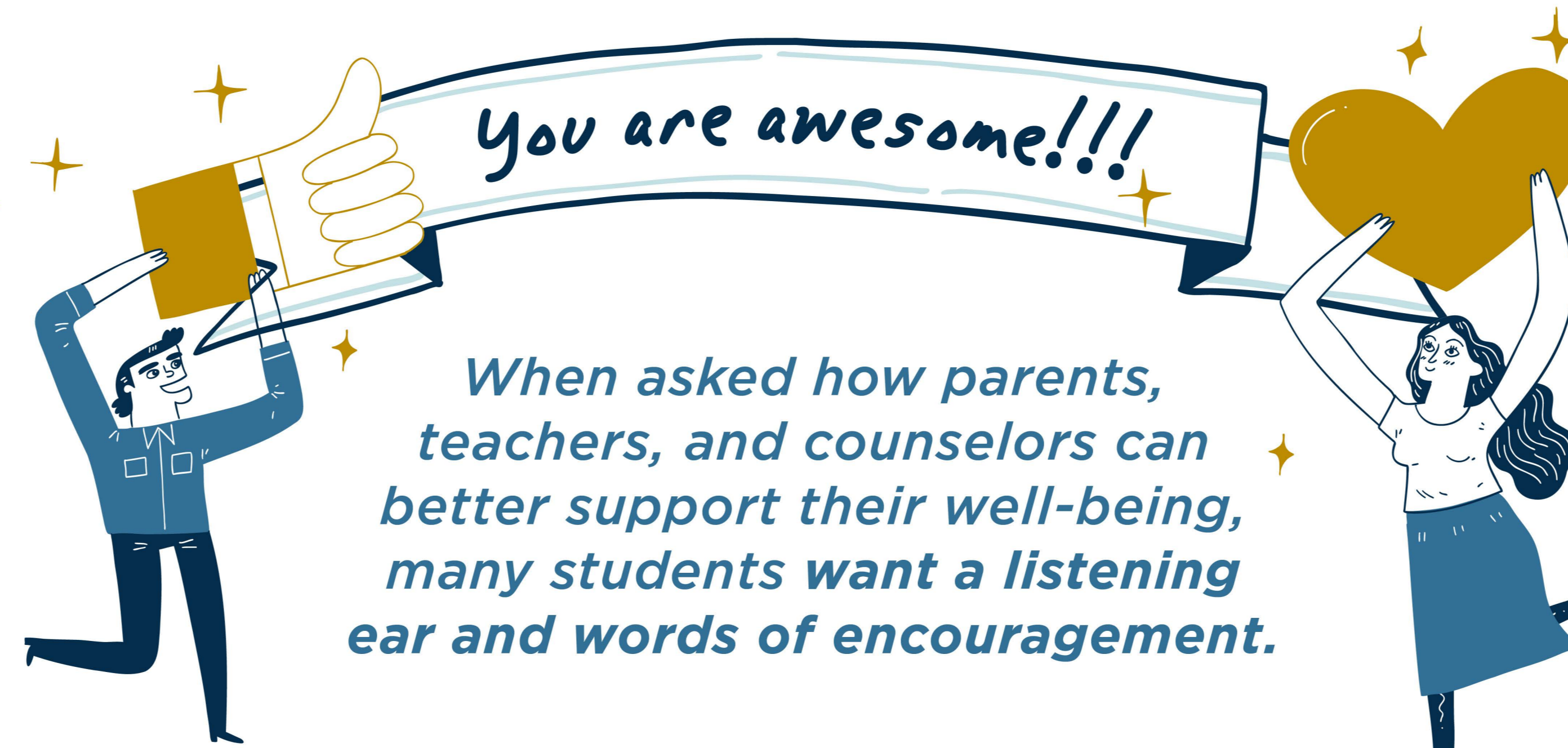
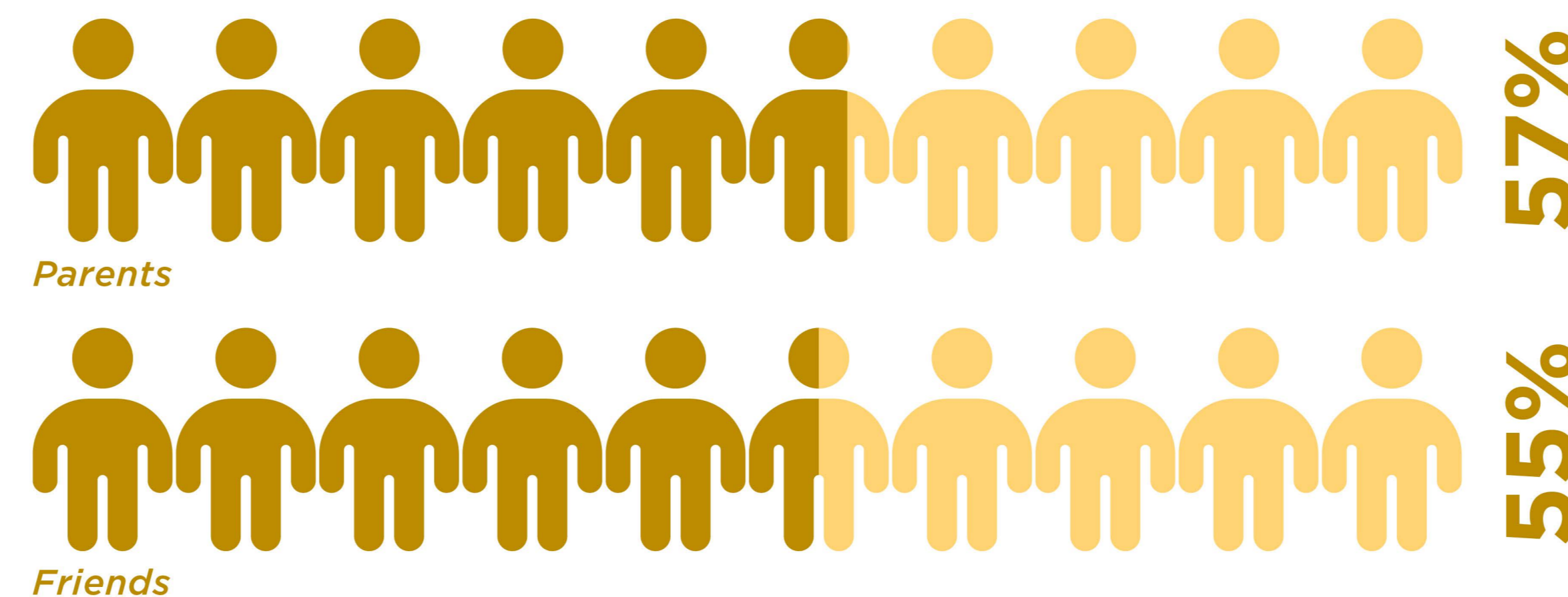


HOWEVER 1 in 4 still express a decline in mental + emotional health

Support System for Students' Mental & Emotional Health



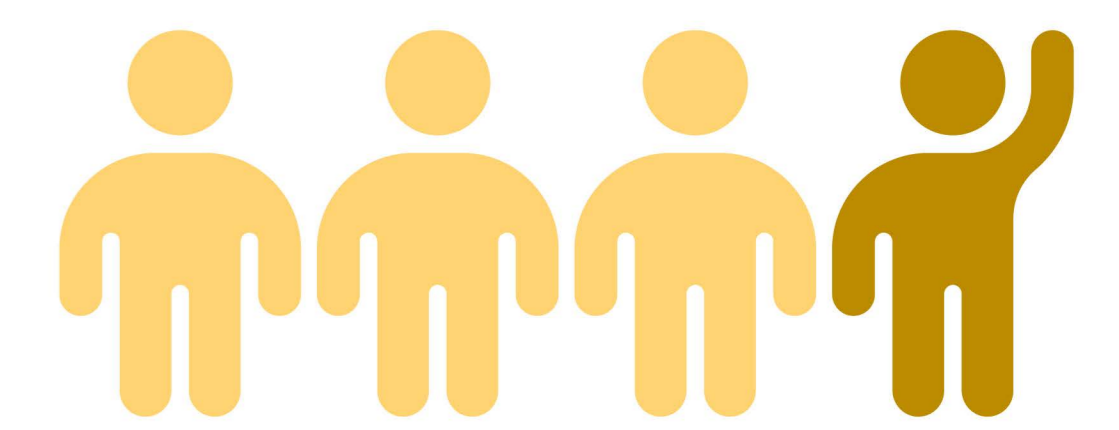
When asked how parents, teachers, and counselors can better support their well-being, many students want a listening ear and words of encouragement.

#4 Skills for the Future

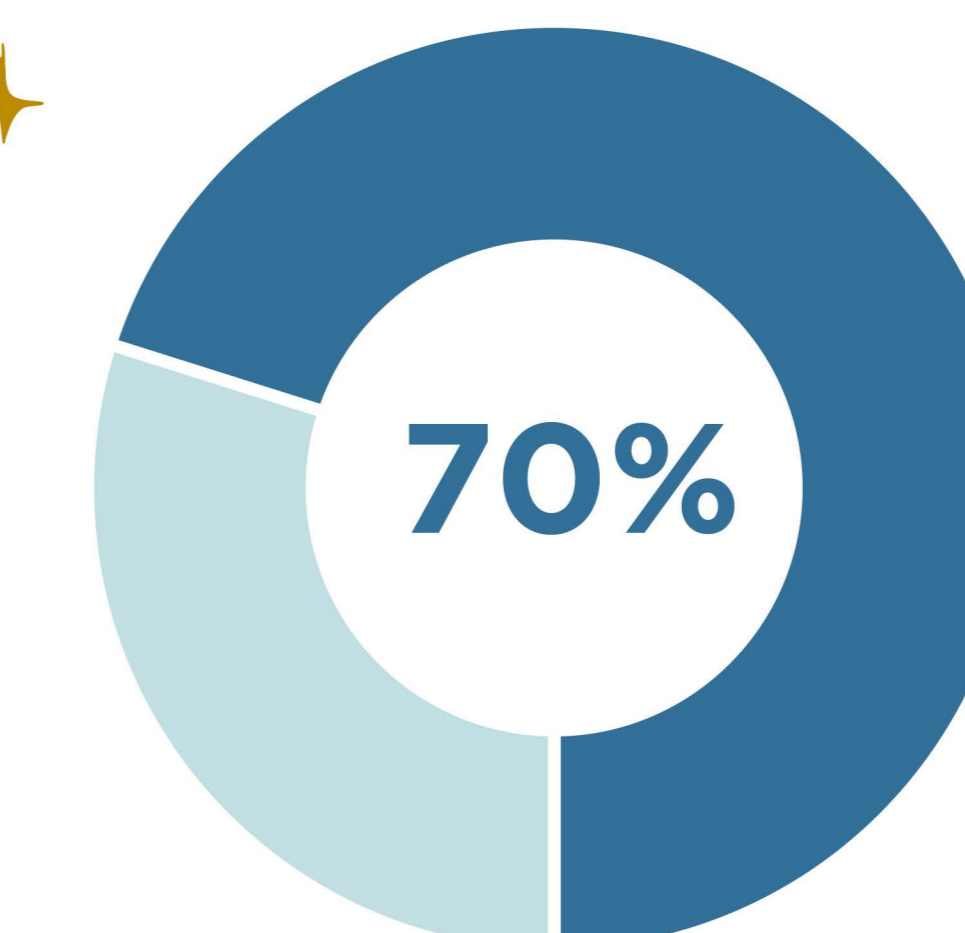
Soft-Skills Learning Opportunity Satisfaction

Students rate communication & problem solving skills as having the most learning opportunities.

Despite students feeling anxious and stressed, stress management is rated the lowest (2.69/5 on average).



1 in 4 students indicate that they do not learn stress management from anywhere.



70% of students are clear on their career choice but only have a confidence level of 6/10 in their ability to pursue these careers
